Package Tours

There is still time to travel behind steam this year.

Sundays, 10 September and 8 October: Eurovapor in Emmental Ex-DB 64-518 (normally shedded at Huttwil) with a train of vintage coaches and a bar car will make several runs over the Huttwil to Langnau section and one return trip from Sumiswald to Wasen in Emmental. It will start at Huttwil at 08.10 and finish there at 18.01. Various ticket supplements are available but a day ticket SUPPLEMENT costing SFrs22 (child SFrs11) looks a bargain in the circumstances.
