Continental railways in Yorkshire by Peter Dransfield

On Saturday the 30th November 1996, the 4th Annual Model Railway Exhibition was held in Mirfield, West Yorkshire with the emphasis on Continental Railways. A number of Societies were represented with both layouts and publicity stands. These included the Swiss, German, Italian, Austrian, Japanese and Hungarian Societies. The Exhibition consisted of over 20 layouts and stands including MITV and Platform 5 the publishers of Todays Railways.

The Swiss Railways Society was represented by three layouts and a publicity stand manned by Alan Pike and Peter Dransfield with assistance from member Clifford Spivey. The Bernese Dogs were well received pulling their festive coloured carts through the Town Centre at various times during the day. Jeffrey Long, the President of the Yorkshire Swiss Club attended the Exhibition for most of the day in full traditional Swiss dress. A number of new members were recruited from an attendance of over 1,000 visitors. The Exhibition was opened by Miss Debbie Lindley, Yorkshire Television's local weather presenter, who made a visit to the Society's stand during the course of the day.

This exhibition is fast becoming an established event mainly for its continental presence, and bookings are already being received for 1997.
