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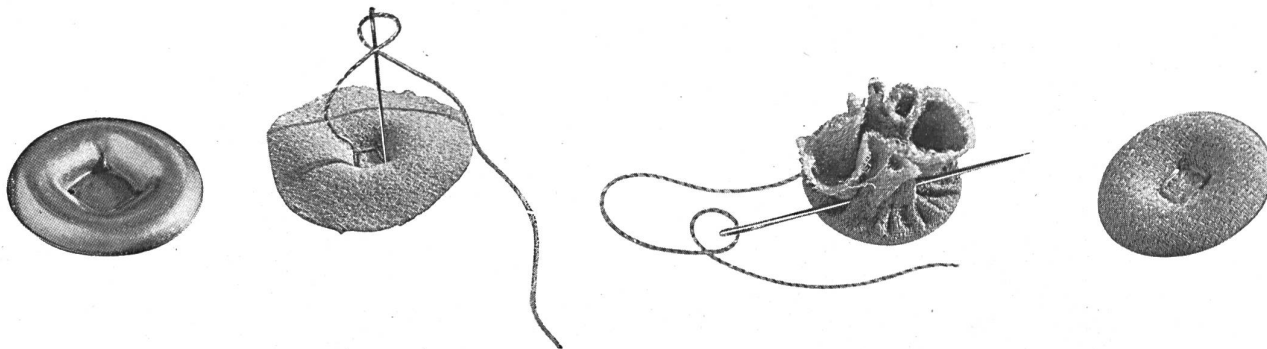
INDISPENSABLE FASHION ACCESSORIES

Cloth buttons have become so popular among fashionable circles, that to-day they are to be considered as "indispensable" accessories. They certainly confer on any garment that personal touch which is the epitome of distinction. The latest button

herewith show clearly how it is done. First place a small circle of cloth on the mould and fix it securely by four centre stitches which can be varied infinitely. Then stretch the cloth over the mould and sew it firmly on the under side... Your "Lurix" button is now ready for use!
