

Writing of the « Swiss Fortnight », one reporter said : « This event represents the most gigantic effort ever made by a country for the purpose of making itself better known to another. » We do not propose to give details here concerning the important series of events organised during the Swiss Fortnight in London ; let us simply repeat that it was an unusually large-scale campaign held mainly in London, Manchester and Glasgow ; it comprised a very full programme of exhibitions, displays, concerts, lectures, theatrical performances, etc. On the individual level, great numbers of shops and stores in the above three towns also played their part by arranging displays of Swiss products in their windows, many of them even hanging out Swiss flags, which gave an unexpected look to certain otherwise very British shopping streets.

*In London, Park Lane House was so to speak the headquarters of the Swiss Fortnight. Here, among other events, was held the exhibition of Swiss fabrics : silks, embroideries and fine cottons. The photographs reproduced opposite give an idea of its elegance.*

*Apart from the decentralised exhibitions in the shopwindows — of which we give a few glimpses here — there were also several displays of Swiss ready-to-wear clothing. One organised for British trade buyers and the trade press met with such remarkable success that instead of the 400 to 500 spectators expected, over 1000 came to see the more than 180 models shown, including some fifteen evening and cocktail dresses made specially for the occasion in St. Gall embroideries and fine cottons. Another display took place at a charity ball given at the Dorchester Hotel on behalf of the Pestalozzi*




