## The chief editor of **TEXTILES SUISSES**

The review «Textiles Suisses» appeared for the first time in 1926, in the form of special numbers of «Swiss Industry and Trade», a periodical published by the Swiss Office for the Development of Trade (S.O.D.T.) in Lausanne. Issued as a quarterly from 1938, «Textiles Suisses» steadily developed into the publication we know today.

Naturally, behind this transformation was the weight of the whole organization of the Swiss Office for the Development of Trade and the backing of the various trade associations in the Swiss textile and clothing industries. But the chief merit for this change goes to Mr. Charles Blaser, head of the Publications Department of S.O.D.T. and chief editor of «Textiles Suisses». His task has never been an easy one. First of all he had to reconcile the sometimes divergent interests and often conflicting ideas of the Swiss manufacturers concerned. Then, what was most important, he had to find a type of presentation and a style of editing that would satisfy the majority of subscribers and readers of this multilingual periodical. «Textiles Suisses», a national periodical with an international circulation, has to keep on a level with its counterparts in other countries, whose editors almost always have far greater freedom of action than those of «Textiles Suisses».

However, in spite of these obstacles, Mr. Charles Blaser succeeded in creating and editing a periodical with a character all its own and which, while devoted primarily to the Swiss textile industries, at the same time keeps

abreast of the latest fashion trends, especially those dictated by Paris.

Now Mr. Charles Blaser has decided to take a well earned rest and retire from his post as chief editor of our periodical as well as from all activity at S.O.D.T.

We would not wish to let this occasion go by without expressing here our deep gratitude to Mr. Charles Blaser for all that he has accomplished during his many years of devoted service. Furthermore we feel sure that we speak on behalf of all his colleagues, both near and far, as well as of readers and users of «Textiles Suisses», in extending to him here our sincere thanks.

His successor has already been appointed: Mr. Piero Bardotto, Master of Political Science, who gained his first experience in the field of publicity in the service of a big ready-to-wear firm, and then played an active part, as secretary of S.O.D.T., in the press and publications departments of our organization. We wish him every success in the interesting but very responsible position he now assumes as chief editor of «Textiles Suisses».

He will, moreover, be able to count on the talented and highly competent cooperation of the assistant editor, Mr. Robert Chessex, whose lively, well-informed articles are a prominent feature of our publication.
