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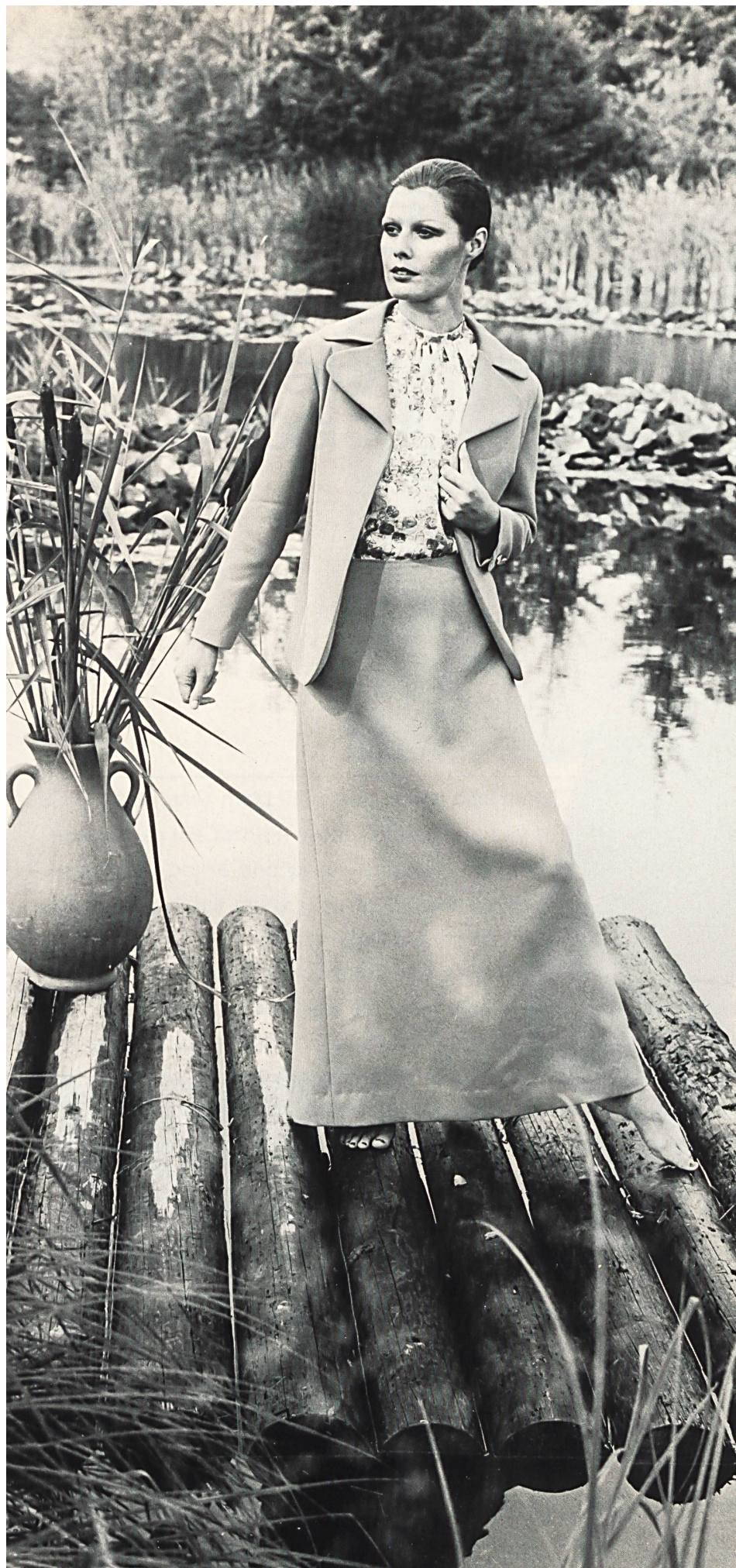
the swiss twist

So, wherever you turn, the Swiss twist remains a step ahead in fashion.



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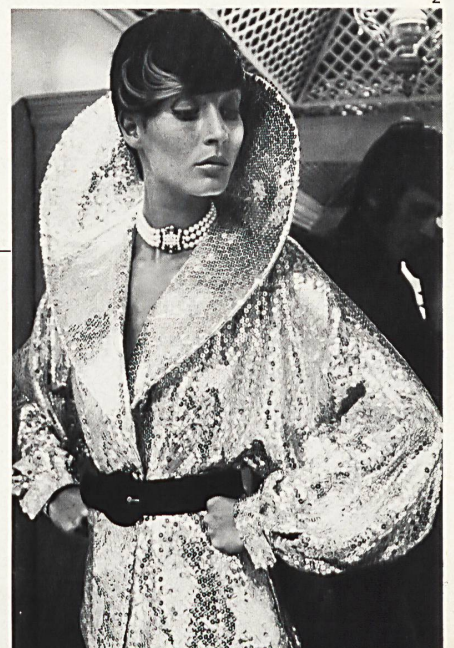
