## Internationaler Wettbewerb

### Finnish Wood

The Finland Wood Innovation Project invites all interested parties from the design and architectural world to the wood construction industry and students and teachers to participate in Wood of Finland – The Finnish International Wood Innovation Competition.

The competition is organized to promote Finnish wood as a modern ecologically sound material for construction, housing and

industrial production. The organizers believe that at this particular phase of modern technology it is possible to find entirely new ways to process and use wood both in construction and industrial production. The closing date of the competition is April 29, 1996.

**Category A:** Innovations for Construction, Living and Environment: The aim is to develop new methods and ideas for using Finnish wood as a building material and to present high-quality applications for them. This type of development requires innovation in terms of technology and production, as well as architectural vision. The innovation can be a construction product, a new application, a structural system for a description of a process. Proposals should be generally applicable and not tied to a specific place and they should cause no ecological risk or damage. It is essential for the innovation to be described sufficiently well so that a clear picture of its application can be obtained.

**Category B:** Innovative Industrial Wooden Products: Finnish wood should be the dominating material in a proposal. Proposals may be anything from a single solid wood object to a new material innovation based on wood, or a production process, or idea using wood in a new way. Innovations should be functionally and aesthetically appropriate for the users and cause no ecological risk or damage. It is essential for the innovation to be described sufficiently well so that a clear picture of its application can be obtained.

**Prizes and Publicity:** A grand prize of FIM 300,000 will be awarded to the winning entry in each category, together with one prize of FIM 150,000 and one prize of FIM 50,000, again in each category.

**Eligibility:** Both catego-

ries are open to all interested parties through-out the world. It is particularly hoped that designers, architects, engineers and students in these fields will participate. Entries may be either individual or group-based. Also, companies in the woodworking industry may take part in the competition.

**Enrolment:** The competition material, including rules and a book describing Finnish wood as modern and ecologically sound material for construction, housing and industrial production, is available against payment of the enrolment fee of FIM 450.
